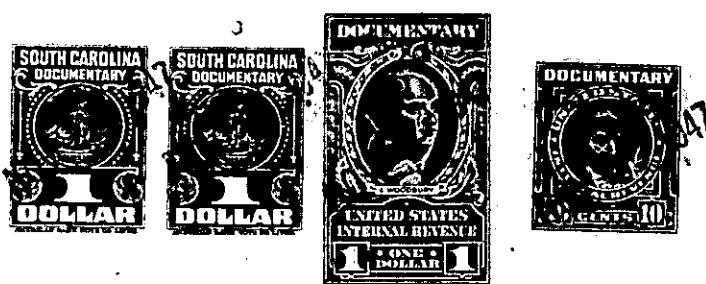

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Bates Township, Greenville
County, State of South Carolina, being known and designated as one-half of Lot No. 57,
on a revised Plat of "Love Estates", which Plat is recorded in the Office of the
RMC for Greenville County in Plat Book "K" at Page 31, and just north of the
village of Travelers Rest. Said one-half of Lot No. 57 is more particularly des-
cribed as follows:

BEGINNING 100 feet from the southern right angle of Love Drive at a
point midway on the line of Lot no. 57 and running S. 25-41 E. 100 feet along
the eastern side of Love Drive to the rear boundary of Lot No. 32; thence along
the joint lines of Lots Nos. 32 and 57, N. 64 E. 90 feet to corner; thence along
the joint lines of Lots Nos. 57 and 58, N. 25-41 W. 100 feet to a point midway
on the said joint line; thence S. 64 W. 90 feet to the beginning corner.

Subject to the same restrictions and limitations as contained in the
deed of W. Raymond Williams, Jr., as Trustee to Annie Lou McDaniel by deed dated
November 19, 1940, and recorded in the RMC Office for Greenville County in Deed
Book 228 at Page 243.

The above described land is the same conveyed to me by
J. G. Willis, Jr. and Mary Frances Willis on the 17th day of
August 19 46, deed recorded in office Register of Mesne Conveyance for
Greenville County, in Book 297 Page 341
