KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That we, James W. Hicks, Sr., ~~XXXXXXXXXXXXXX~~ Nellie H. Hendrix, Marguerite H. Ashmore, Lucy H. Chiles and Alvin R. Hicks,

in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of... to effect partition of the said lands of the Estate of J. M. Hicks, deceased, and of Minnie Jones Hicks, deceased,

to us... in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by Buena H. Long,

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Buena H. Long, her heirs and assigns,

All of our undivided right, title and interest of, in and to:

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Gantt Township, Greenville

County, State of South Carolina, about five and one-half miles south of the City of Greenville, south of Augusta Road and west of Fork Shoals Road, and near the intersection thereof, being shown and designated as Tract Number (No. 5) Five on a plat of the property of said J. M. Hicks Estate, made by W. J. Riddle, Surveyor, Apr. 26, 1944, recorded in Plat Book _____ at page _____, R. M. C. office for said County, and, according to said plat, having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin, in line of property of the R. D. Hicks estate, corner of Tract No. 4 on said plat, which tract is being conveyed to James W. Hicks, Sr., and running thence S. 6-45 E. 245 feet along line of said R. D. Hicks estate, to iron pin; thence S. 55-30 W. 882 feet along line of said R. D. Hicks estate, to iron pin; thence N. 50-45 W. 262 feet to stone; ; thence N. 48-30 E. 716 feet to stone, corner of said Tract No. 4; thence N. 74-45 E. 387 feet along line of said Tract No. 4, to point of beginning; and, according to said plat, containing Six and 70/100 (6.70) acres, more or less, and being a part of a tract of Twenty and 7/10 (20.7) acres, owned and possessed by the said J. M. Hicks at the time of his decease.

The said Lucy H. Chiles conveyed her undivided interest in said tract of 20.7 acres of land, more or less, to Buena H. Long by deed dated Aug. 13, 1943, recorded in Vol. 256, page 310, said R.M.C. office.

The said Alvin R. Hicks conveyed his undivided interest in said tract of 20.7 acres of land, more or less, to Nellie H. Hendrix by deed dated Mar. 21, 1946, recorded in Vol. 289, page 279, said R. M. C. office.

By this deed, said Lucy H. Chiles and Alvin R. Hicks convey their undivided interests in said lands, which was derived from estate of Minnie Jones Hicks, deceased.
