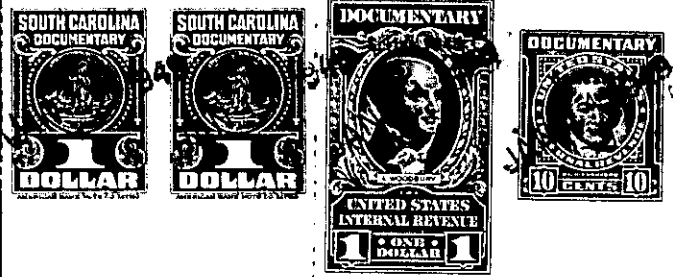

E. Cox, and being the same lots of land conveyed to us by deed from V. E. Cox recorded in the office of the R. I. C. for Greenville County in Deed Book at page , (said deed bearing date of April 27th 1946, and having the following courses and distances, to wit :-

Beginning on a stake in the center of Vernon Street, joint corner of lots 10 and 11, and runs thence with the dividing line of lots 10 and 11 N. 55-30 E. 180 feet to a stake on the original line of the original tract; thence with the said line S. 34-30 E. 100 feet to a stake on the said line; thence with the dividing line of lots 12 and 13 S. 55-30 W. 180 feet to a stake in the center of Vernon Street; thence with the center of Vernon Street N. 34-30 W. 100 feet to the beginning corner.
