All that lot of land situate in the County and State aforesaid, being known and designated as Lot 44 as shown on plat of P. & N. Railroad Property, made by H. G. Bailey, and described as follows:

BEGINNING at the North corner of Lot 45 and running thence N. 33-50 E. 288 feet, more or less, to P. & N. right-of-way; thence along said right-of-way to the corner of Lot 47; thence with line of said lot 36 feet to Goodwin Street; thence S. 21-30 E. 10 feet; thence with the line of Lot 47, 180 feet to Church Street; thence with said Street, 10 feet to line of Lot 46; thence with line of said lot, 150 feet to an iron pin on Goodwin Street; thence with said Street, N. 21-30 W. 170 ft. to the beginning corner, containing also said Goodwin Street and said 10 foot alley and being the same lot of land conveyed to John W. Armstrone by T. Frank Hunt, dated February 12, 1920, recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Book 70, Page 503.
