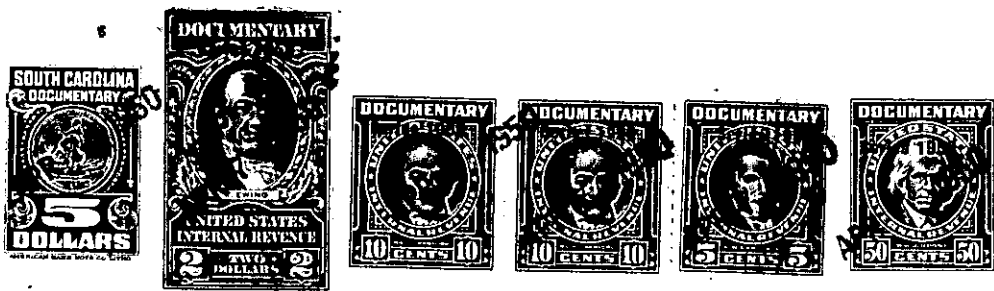

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS. That We, Kathleen R. Burgess and  
Christine R. Carlin  
in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) and other  
valuable considerations Dollars  
to us in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents  
by James N. Long  
(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these  
presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said James N. Long

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Township,  
County, State of South Carolina, about one mile northwest of the corporate limits  
of the City of Greenville, near the Buncombe Road and known as Lot No.  
216 of a subdivision of McCarey land as set forth on a plat recorded  
in Plat Book A, page 278 and 279. The lot begins at a stake on the  
east side of Gridley Street at a point 198 feet from the northeastern  
corner of Gridley and McCarey Streets and runs thence S. 77 E. 204  
feet to stake at corner of lot number 204; thence with a line of  
lot number 204 N. 13 E. 66 feet to stake in corner of lot 215; thence  
with the line of that lot N. 77 W. 204 feet to stake on Gridley; thence  
with Gridley S. 13 W. 66 feet to the beginning corner.

This is the same lot of land conveyed to T. J. Newby by C. Ida  
Charles, Trustee, dated Sept. 1, 1914, said deed recorded in Deed Book  
20, page 170. The said Newby died leaving a will by the terms of  
which this lot went to his daughter, Leila Newby Reynolds for the  
term of her natural life and at her death to her bodily heirs. The  
said Leila Newby Reynolds has since died leaving as her sole heirs  
her two daughters, Kathleen R. Burgess and Christine R. Carlin.  
The will of T. J. Newby is on file in the office of the Probate Court  
for Greenville County in File 290, Apt. 25. There was no administration  
upon the estate of Leila Newby Reynolds.
