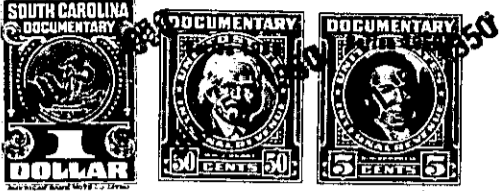

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Burnett M. Cannon, his heirs and assigns forever

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Highland Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina all that parcel or lot of land, about one fourth mile west from Few's Chapel Church, lying on the south side of the Few, Bridge Road, and being bounded on the North by the said road and lands of A. L. Cannon on the East by other lands of A. B. Cannon on the South by lands of Harold Few, on the west by lands of Harold Few, and being of the same lands conveyed to me by A. B. Cannon and is recorded in the office of R. M. C. in and for Greenville County in Deed Book "L" Page 337, and having the following metes and bounds:

Beginning at an iron pin in the southern edge of the Few Bridge Road, being the joint corner of A. L. Cannon, Harold Few, and the land being conveyed, and runs thence with Harold Few's line S. 17- 30 E. 810.5 feet to an iron pin in the branch to Harold Few's Corner; thence with Harold Few's line N. 38- 30 E. 251 feet to an iron pin on the said line; thence a new line N. 17- 30 W. 668.5 feet to a point in the center of Few's Bridge road; thence with the said road S. 77-45 W. 208. 6 to the beginning corner, containing 3.67 acres more or less.
