J. T. Wood, his heirs and assigns forever,

All that piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, Highland Township, located on the Northwestern side of a large gully, and being described as follows:

BEGINNING at a point in the center of the Old State Road, opposite the head of a large gully to the North line of the home tract; thence with the outside boundary line of said tract in a Northwesternly direction following the line of adjoining owners, to the beginning corner, and being the Northwestern portion of a tract of land conveyed to John T. Wood, Sr., as shown by a deed recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Book CCC at page 549.
