Office for Greenville County in Volume 163 - 366, less, however, three conveyances by the grantor to W. B. Louis, Frank A. Jones and Corrine Mayhew Jones and Duke Power Co., said deeds to be recorded. Said conveyances were executed in order to remove any question relative to overlapping boundaries between the grantors property and Aberdeen Highlands, Brushy Creek now constituting the boundary line between said two tracts.
