CHARTER
BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE

WHEREAS,
C. V. RICHBOURG, ANDERSON, S. C.
E. J. RICHBOURG, ANDERSON, S. C.

did on the 29th day of August, 1952, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration, signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given

SECOND: That the name of the proposed corporation is SUPMA SARE-WAY COMPANY

THIRD: That the principal place of business is GREENVILLE, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it proposes to buy, sell, trade and deal in, at wholesale and retail, groceries, provisions, foods, supplies, merchandise as are or may be sold in a general store, and to conduct a general grocery and general merchandise and mercantile business; to lease, buy and otherwise acquire real and personal property; to lease, sell, mortgage and do use of same for all things subsidiary, necessary or convenient for carrying out and into effect the main purposes and objects of the organization of the corporation and the furtherance of the general mercantile business.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is One Thousand (\$1000.00) Dollars payable on call of the Director, in cash or its equivalent.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is 10 of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, and in compliance with the provisions of the Act, Chapter 153, Act No. 142, of the Session of 1952, at which time a majority of the shares were present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: C. V. RICHBOURG and E. J. RICHBOURG

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected a President, C. V. RICHBOURG; as Vice-President, E. J. RICHBOURG; as Secretary, E. J. RICHBOURG; as Treasurer, C. V. RICHBOURG

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153, Act No. 142, of the Session of 1952, relating to the filing of this Declaration with the Secretary of State, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent of the capital stock of the corporation has been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent of the capital stock of the corporation has been paid to the Secretary of State in full public notes of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State, and the corporation is published in the Greenville News a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, O. FRANK THORNTON, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority conferred by the aforesaid Code and Acts, and under the authority of the Seal of the Secretary of State of the State of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes hereinbefore set forth, do hereby certify that the said Corporation is authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
