of Greenville aforesaid, by virtue of the aforesaid decree, and upon receipt of \$10.00

HAVE GRANTED, conveyed and released, and by these presents, DO GRANT, convey and release
unto the said W. C. Brock, all the right, title and interest of the De-
fendant, Willie Brock, in and to the following described real estate:

"All that tract of land situate in Oaklawn Township, in the County
of Greenville, State of South Carolina, containing 16-1/2 acres, more or
less, adjoining lands of W. H. Williams, Jas, H. Woodside and Mrs, Nellie
Sullivan, being a part of that tract of land conveyed to Peter Shorter by
S. J. Douthit, deed bearing date of December 2, 1878, and by Peter Shorter
conveyed to G. W. Browning and G. W. Browning conveyed to me, the said W.H.
Williams, by deed bearing date of December 1, 1882,

ALSO, that other tract of land in Township, County and State aforesaid
containing 3-1/16 acres, more or less, described as follows: Beginning
on a stone 3x on the Pelzer Road near Washington Church; thence N. 44E.
7.77 chains to a stone 3x; thence N. 80-1/4 W. 9.30 chains to a stone 3x
