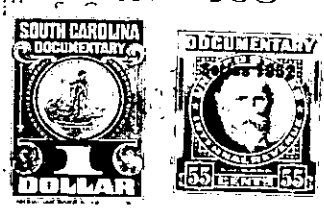

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Chick Springs Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, near the Pleasant Grove Baptist Church and South-East therefrom, about two miles South from the City of Greer, lying on the northwest side of the old Greenville-Spartanburg Highway, designated as lot No. 12 on a plat of property made for the W.A.
