All that tract of land situate on the South side of the Darby Road, in O'Neal Township, Greenville County, South Carolina, about 10 miles Northeast of the Greenville County Courthouse and having according to a plat made by W. A. Hudson, Surveyor, December 11, 1903, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:
