The land to which reference has heretofore been made are more specifically described as follows:

C. Riddle, Reg. Land Surveyor, dated April 27, 1953, said plat being recorded in Plat Book D.C. Page and reference is here made to that plat for a more detailed description which is as follows: DECHN ING at an iron pin on or near granch adjoining lands of Grady L. Smith and running thence along the line o' project of John H. Abercrombie S. 21-00 h. 682 feet to iron pin; thance H. 64-30 W. 73-9 feet to iron pin; thence along lands of W. A. Knight N. 89-40 W. 238 feet to iron pin on edge of old road; thence S. 62-00 W. 138 feet to iron pin on edge of old road; thence S. 62-00 W. 138 feet to iron pin in the Georgia Road; thence N. 70-16 E. 96.3 feet to iron pin; thence along line of lands of Grady L. Smith N. 50-45 E. 603 feet to iron pin near branch; thence S. 19-30 E. 153.5 feet to the beginning corner and containing 6.65 acres, more or less.

Baptist Church has continued as a going religious institution since the year 18/8 according to Church him my and its House of Worship has been located on the tract of land above described during that entire period. According to local tradition the Church projectly was purchased from a gentlemen by the name of Cox or was liven to the Church by Mr. Cox and was a portion of a five hundred (500) acre farm which he cannot in that locality. All of the other lands belonging to Mr. Cox have long since been conveyed away but the Church property as above described has remained unconveyed and has been recognized as the property of the said Church.
