

Paul Lawson, his heirs and assigns forever.

All that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville

Township, Greenville County, State

of South Carolina, about one and one half miles north of the County Court House and near the American Spinning Compan Mill and having the following metes and bounds and courses and distances, to wit:

BEGINNING at a stake on a ten foot alley, (sometimes called Mill Street) and running thence about North $21-\frac{1}{2}$ East 120 feet to a stake; thence parallel with Pinckney Street, North $68-\frac{1}{2}$ West 44 feet to a stake; thence parallel with Southern Railway Company, South $38-\frac{1}{2}$ West 129 feet to a stake on the above mentioned alley; thence along said tenfoot alley, South $68-\frac{1}{2}$ East 92 feet to the beginning corner.
