"All that piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being in Fairview Township, Greenville County, South Carolina, on the east side of Reedy River containing 38 acres, more or less, and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING on stake at McKittrick's Bridge; thence N. $2\frac{1}{2}$ E. 18.00 to stake on branch; thence S. $87\frac{3}{4}$ W. 14.50 to river; thence follow the meanders of river to McKittrick's Bridge; thence N. 79 E. 9.37 to stake in road; thence N. $70\frac{1}{4}$ E. 6.47 to stake in road; thence N. $44\frac{1}{2}$ E. 2.91 to the beginning corner, being identically the same property conveyed to W. V. Tollison by J. Q. Robertson by deed dated September 6, 1905, recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Book VVV, Page 283.

ALSO: That certain other piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being in Fairview Township, Greenville County, South Carolina, and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at iron wood in east bank of Reedy River; thence N. $3\frac{1}{2}$ E. 29.00 to stone 3X; thence N. 68 E. 7.68 to stone 3X; thence S. 3 W. 32.32 to stake on river bank; thence up said river to beginning corner, and containing 25 acres, more or less.

ALSO: That certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being in Fairview Township, Greenville County, South Carolina, and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING on Reedy River, thence N. 2 E. 24.50 to stone 3X; thence N. 68 E. 9.40 to stone 3X; thence S. $3\frac{1}{2}$ W. 29.00 to iron wood on river bank; thence up said river to beginning corner and containing 25 acres, more or less.
