This indenture made the 5th Day of February, between J. H. Robinson, hereinafter called the retiring Partner, of the one part, and J. A. Watkins, and Mrs. Delphena W. Arnold, hereinafter called the continuing Partners of the other part:

WHEREAS, under an indenture of partnership, dated the 10th Day of December , 1952 , the parties hereto have in partnership carried on the business of morticians under the firm and style of Robinson, Watkins, and Arnold Mortuary, of Green-ville, South Carolina, and it has been agreed that the said partnership shall be determined, and that the retiring partner should receive the amount due to him for his share in the said business, and the capital, stock, effects, profits, claims, and good will thereof, and should withdraw from the said business, leaving the same to be carried on by the continuing partners for their own benefit, or otherwise, as they might think proper; AND,

WHEREAS, valuations and estimates of the property, assets, credits, profits, losses, future rights, and effects of the said business and the good will thereof, have been made, and the same, after deducting the outstanding debts and liabilities of the said partnership, have been agreed to be taken as between the parties hereto as of the value of \$7840.00

Dollars, of which the one half share of the retiring partner has been fixed and agreed at the sum of \$3920.00

Dollars.

NOW, this indenture witnesseth as follows:

I. In pursuance of the said agreement and in consideration of the premises, the parties hereto dissolve as and from the <u>5th</u> Day of February, 1954, the partnership heretofore subsisting between them in the business aforesaid. And notice of such dissolution and of the intended continuance of the said business by the continuing partners, shall be forthwith advertised and notified to the public and creditors of the said partnership by a proper and reasonable means, the form of which will be left to the discretion of the continuing partners.
