And I hereby declare that any act or thing lawfully done hereunder by my said attorney shall be binding on myself, and my heirs, legal and personal representatives, and assigns; whether the same shall have been done before or after my death or other revocation of this instrument, unless and until reliable intelligence or notice thereof shall have been received by my said attorney; and whether or not I, the granter of this instrument, shall have been reported or listed, either officially or otherwise, as "missing" or "missing in action" as those words are used in military parlance it being the intendment hereof that such status designation shall not bar my attorney from fully and completely exercising and continuing to exercise any and all powers and rights herein granted, and that such report of "missing" or "missing in action" shall neither constitute nor be interpreted as constituting notice of my death nor operate to revoke this instrument.

In the event my said Attorney, my wife, JULIANNE H. ILER, shall die, refuse, or otherwise be unable or fail to act hereunder; I then do hereby appoint my mother, MARY BRYEN ILER, my true and lawful attorney from and immediately after the happening of such event to act in and manage all my estate, affairs, and property in the same manner and with the same powers and authorities as if the name of said MARY BRYEN ILER had throughout these presents been inserted instead of the name of said JULIANNE H. ILER (except that the authority hereinabove granted in paragraph nine shall not be exercised in behalf of, or enure to the benefit of, anyone other than said son, CLAUDE B. ILER, III.).
