That I, Homer Dial, in the State aforesaid,
in consideration of the sum of One Hundred and No/100 (\$100.00) - - - DOLLARS,

to the grantor(s) in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by the grantee(s) (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Mattie Dial Free and Janie Dial Rice, their heirs and assigns forever:

All that undivided interest in and to all that certain tract of land in Greenville Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, containing forty-five (45) acres, more or less, and having, according to plat made by W. D. Neves, November, 1913, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at the Southwest corner of said tract and at the corner of land formerly owned by the Federal Land Bank and running thence with the line of the Federal Land Bank Land S. 82-15 E. 21 chains to stake in branch; thence up the branch as a line the following courses and distances to-wit: N. 27 E. 2.50 chains; thence N. 17-30 E. 18.10 chains to stone in land formerly owned by R. H. Earle; thence with the line of said land S. 88-40 W. 13 chains to stone; thence N. 82-15 W. 14 chains to stone, corner of land formerly owned by Avery Patton; thence S. 1-30 W. 18.05 chains to the point of beginning.

Said premises being the identical land conveyed to Dunk Dial by R. H. Earle by two deeds recorded in Volume 20 at Page 512, and Volume 57 at Page 429. Dunk Dial died interstate October 31, 1937, leaving his widow, Carrie Dial, and the six children, namely: Alvin Dial, Homer Dial, Lucille Dial Maxwell, William Dial, Mattie Dial Free and Janie Dial Rice.

And the grantor(s) do(es) hereby bind the grantor(s) and the grantor's(s) Heirs, Executors and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the grantee(s) hereinabove named, and the grantee's(s) Heirs and Assigns against the grantor(s) and the grantor's(s) Heirs and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
