WHEREAS, said deed described said property in general terms only, and it is the purpose of this deed to supplement the aforementioned deed by more adequately describing so much of said property as is located in Greenville County, South Carolina,

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS That the said The Florence Mills, for and in consideration of the premises and as a part of its Plan of Dissolution and Liquidation, and as a supplement to the aforementioned deed of even date herewith, has granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Cone Mills Corporation all real estate and interests in real estate owned by the grantor in Greenville County, South Carolina, including, but not limited to, the following:

All those several pieces, parcels or tracts of land situate, lying and being near the City of Greenville, in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, containing in the aggregate 181.74 acres, more or less, and being shown as Tracts 1, 2 and 5 on a plat of Property of American Spinning Co., Greenville, S. C., made by J. E. Serrine & Company, Engineers, May 31, 1930, and having, according to said plat, the following metes and bounds:

Tract 1 (Consisting of 145.37 Acres)
