of South Carolina, lying and being on the easterly side of Midland Street, in the City of
Greenville, being shown as Lot No. 101 on the plat of University Heights as recorded
in the RMC Office for Greenville County, S. C. in Plat Book BB, page 21, reference to
said plat being hereby craved for a more particular metes and bounds description.
This is the same property conveyed to my father, C. F. Glenn, by deed of William T.
Bates, dated August 5, 1952, and recorded in said RMC Office in Deed Book 461, page
203.

Also all my undivided one-ninth (1/9th) interest in and to all that certain piece,
parcel or lot of land, with the buildings and improvements thereon, lying and being
on the easterly side of Midland Street, in the City of Greenville, S. C., and adjoin-
ing the property above described, being shown as Lot No. 127 on the plat of the prop-
erty of University Heights as recorded in the RMC Office for Greenville County, S. C.
