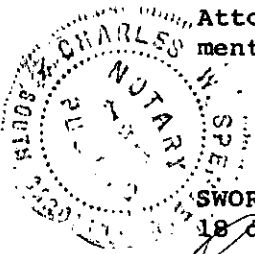


Willie T. Taylor, who lived in Anderson, but died about 1925 leaving a widow and at least two children.

William T. Taylor was the son of Emma Taylor.

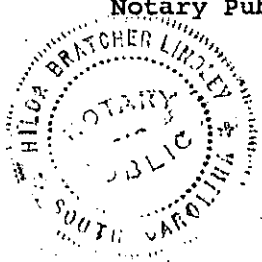
