All that piece, parcel or tract of land, lying, situate, and being in the State and County aforesaid, being known as the old James Evans Home Place adjoining lands now or formerly of Sallie Baty (Beattie) on the east, and Nettie Burton on the west, and bounded as follows:

BEGINNING on a Black Gum and running thence N. 67 1/2 W. 11.00 to a rock X3OM; thence N. 51 3/4 E. 15.25 to a Double White Oak X3OM; thence 20 1/2 W. 4.00 to a Rock; thence N. 63 W. 11.70 to a Rock OM; thence N. 39 1/4 E. 18.75 to a Rock X3OM; thence S. 40 1/2 E. 33.30 to a Rock X3OM; thence S. 51 1/4 W. 19.00 to a small apple tree; thence N. 86 1/2 W. 7.70 to the beginning corner, and contains sixty and three-fourths (60 3/4) acres, more or less; being the same conveyed to H. L. Sammons and R. L. Sammons by James Evans by deed dated July 18, 1906 and recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Vol. 4, at Page 595, the interest of the said R. L. Sammons having subsequently been conveyed to H. L. Sammons by deeds dated May 12, 1926, recorded in Deed Vol. 86 at Pages 215 and 217.

OM on the Spartanburg Road (now the old White Horse Road); thence with said road to the crossing of the G & N Railroad bed; thence with the center of the G & N tracks, N. 6-45 E. 188 feet, N. 0-24 W. 150 feet and N. 7-09 W. 200 feet to a point on said track; thence S. 50 3/4 W. 592.02 feet, more or less, to R.O. 3XOM; thence N. 53 W. 7.90 chains to the beginning corner; being a portion of the tract containing 44 3/8 acres which was conveyed to H.
