Mattie Moon, her heirs and assigns forever: All our right, title and interest in and to the following described real estate:

All that piece, parcel or lot of land, with the improvements thereon, situate, lying and being in or near Greenville, in the County of Greenville, South Carolina, and being more particularly described as Lot No. 348, Section 2, as shown on plat entitled "Subdivision for Abney Mills, Brandon Plant, Greenville, South Carolina", made by Dalton & Neves, Engineers, Greenville, S. C., February 1959 and recorded in the Office of the R. M. C. for Greenville County in Plat Book QQ at pages 56 to 59. According to said plat the within described lot is also known as No. 11 Furman Street and fronts thereon 75 feet; being the same conveyed to Willard T. Moon and Carrie H. Moon by Abney Mills by deed dated May 12, 1959, and recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Vol. 627 at Page 305.

Carrie H. Moon died intestate on March 3, 1967, leaving as her sole heirs at law, her husband, Willard T. Moon, five children, Robert T. Moon, George Earl Moon, Lester A. Moon, L. Kenneth Moon and J. Wallace Moon; Ethel E. Moon, a widow of a deceased son, Paul A. Moon who died in June 1962 leaving his widow as his only heir; and two grandchildren, Charles T. Moon and Aimee M. Roaks, children of a deceased son; Charles A. Moon, who died intestate in December 1965, leaving his two children as his only heirs. Willard T. Moon died intestate in February 1971 leaving as his heirs at law the five sons, the widow of Paul A. Moon and the two grandchildren.
