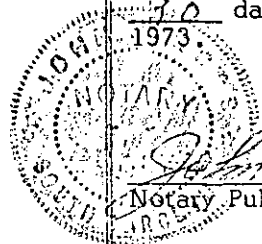
Personally appeared before me Elma H. Bonnett, formerly Elma Henson, who being first duly sworn makes the following Affidavit and statement regarding the estates of Clyde Henson and Claude Henson:

Clyde Henson died intestate in Greenville County, State of South Carolina, on the Nov. day of 16, 1941, leaving as his sole heirs at law his wife, Elma Henson (now Bonnett), and his children, Fleming Henson, (also known as Flemmy Henson, L. C. Henson, Evelyn Henson Farmer, and Sylvia Henson Farmer.

Claude Henson died intestate in Greenville County, State of South Carolina, on the Sept day of 23, 1951, leaving as his sole heirs at law his wife, Monarch Henson, (now Monarch H. Hawkins), and his children, Bobby Dean Henson, Sallie Henson Smith, Glenn T. Henson, Lewis J. Henson, (also known as Jackie Lewis Henson), and Hattie Ethel Henson Ross.

That the undivided interests of Clyde Henson and Claude Henson in a certain tract of land described in Deed Volume 235, page 321, were divided between the respective heirs at law of the said Clyde Henson and Claude Henson as shown by deeds recorded in Volume 873, page 16, and 871, page 155.
