In consideration of such loans and indebtedness as shall be made by or become due to THE SOUTH CAROLINA NATIONAL BANK OF CHARLESTON (hereinafter referred to as "Bank") to or from the undersigned, jointly or severally, and until all of such loans and indebtedness have been poid in full, or until quorifficial years following the death of the last survivor of the undersigned, whichever first occurs, the undersigned [[chilly and severally, promise and agree

- 1. To pay, prior to becoming delinquent, all taxes, assessments, dues and charges of every kind imposed or levied upon the real property described below; and
- 2. Without the prior written consent of Bank, to refrain from creating or permitting any lien or other encumbrance (other than those presently existing) to exist on, and from transferring, selling, assigning or in any manner disposing of, the real property described below, or any interest therein; or any leases, rents or funds held under escrow agreement relating to said premises; and
- 3. The property referred to by this agreement is described as follows: ALL that lot of land on the southeastern side of North Earbor Drive (formerly Woody's Drive, in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, being shown as Lot 26 on plat of property of Lloyd Gilstrap recorded in Plat Book 00 at Page 66 and 67 and also shown as Lot 26 on Plat of property of Lindsey L. Neese and Barbara K. Neese dated March, 1969, prepared by Dalton & Neese, and having, according to said latter plat, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

Beginning at an iron pin on the southeasternside of North Harbor Drive at the joint front corner of lots 25 and 26 and running thence with the line of Lot 2, S. 38-30 E. 230 feet to a nail in the center of Old Farr's Bridge Road; thence with said Road, S. 82-30 W. 116.6 feet to a nail; thence N. 38-30- W. 170 feet, more or less, to an iron pin on North Harbor Drive; thence with said Drive, N. 51-50 E. 100 feet to the point of beginning.

That if default be made in the performance of any of the terms hereof, or if default be made in any payment of principal or interest, on any notes hereof or hereafter signed by the undersigned, the undersigned agrees and does hereby assign the rents and profits arising or to arise from said premises to the Bank and agrees that any judge of jurisdiction may, at chambers or otherwise, appoint a receiver of the described premises, with full authority to take possession thereof and collect the rents and profits and hold the same subject to the further order of said court.

- 4. That if default be made in the performance of any of the terms hereof, or if any of said rental or other sums be not paid to Bank when due, Bank, at its election, may declare the entire remaining unpaid principal and interest of any obligation or indebtedness then remaining unpaid to Bank to be due and payable forthwith.
- 5. That Bank may and is hereby authorized and permitted to cause this instrument to be recorded at such time and in such places as Bank, in its discretion, may elect.
- 6. Upon payment of all indebtedness of the undersigned to Bank this agreement shall be and become void and of no effect, and until then it shall apply to and bind the undersigned, their heirs, legatees, devisees, administrators, executors, successors and assigns, and inure to the benefit of Bank and its successors and assigns. The affidavit of any officer or department manager of Bank showing any part of said indebtedness to remain unpaid shall be and constitute conclusive evidence of the validity, effectiveness and continuing force of this agreement and any person may and is hereby authorized to rely thereon
