

ARTICLE II.

Termination, Amendment, Resignation and Removal

§A. Power not Affected by Principal's Incapacity.

This power of attorney shall not be affected by physical disability or mental incompetence of the principal which renders the principal incapable of managing his own estate. It is my intent that the authority conferred herein shall be exercisable notwithstanding my physical disability or mental incompetence.

§B. Termination

This power of attorney shall remain in full force and effect until I have revoked this power of attorney by written instrument recorded in the public records of the county aforesaid.

§C. Amendment

This power of attorney may be amended by me at any time and from time to time but such amendment shall not be effective as to third persons dealing with Attorney without notice of such amendment unless such amendment shall have been recorded in the public records of the county aforesaid.

§D. Resignation

Any Attorney named herein may resign by delivering to me in writing a copy of such resignation and recording the original in the public records of the county aforesaid. Upon such resignation and recording, Attorney shall thereupon be divested of all authority under this power of attorney.

§E. Removal

Any Attorney named herein may be removed by written instrument executed by me and recorded in the public records of the county aforesaid.

ARTICLE III.

Incidental Powers and Binding Effect

In connection with the exercise of the powers herein described, Attorney is fully authorized and empowered to perform any other acts or things necessary, appropriate, or incidental thereto, with the same validity and effect as if I were personally present, competent, and personally exercised the powers myself. All acts lawfully done by Attorney hereunder during any period of my disability or mental incompetence shall have the same effect and inure to the benefit of and bind me and my heirs, devisees, legatees and personal representatives as if I were mentally competent and not disabled. The powers herein conferred may be exercised by Attorney alone

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
