


This Indenture made the Nineteenth day of August in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and Eighty Eight Between Reuben Stringer of the State of South Carolina and Ninety Six District of the one part, and John Moore of the State aforesaid of the other part, Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of Sixty pounds Sterling to him the said Reuben Stringer well and truly paid the Receipt whereof the said Reuben Stringer doth here by acknowledge hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents both Grant bargain and sell and deliver unto the said John Moore in his actual possession by virtue of a bargain and sale to him made by the said Reuben Stringer a Certain Tract of land containing two hundred acres Situate in the District of Ninety Six west of the old boundary line on the North side of big Saluda River bounding on said River butting and bounding Southward: by on land laid out to Edwin Smith and on all other sides vacant at the time of the Original Survey, the said Tract of land being Granted to William Hollins by his Excellency William Moutrie Esquire on the Second day of October in the year of our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and Eighty Six and Recorded in grant book B. 1316 page 230. Together with all and singular the ways waters water courses, Minerals, and every appurtenance thereunto belonging, To have and to hold the said plantation or Tract of land and all and singular the premises here by Granted and Released unto the said John Moore his heirs Executors Administrators and assigns forever, and the said Reuben Stringer for him self his heirs and assigns both Covenant and agree with the said John Moore his heirs and assigns by these presents in manner and form following that is to say that the said Moore shall have an absolute and perfect right in fee simple without any manner of Condition or limitation to the aforesaid tract of land and also that it shall be lawfull for the said John Moore his heirs and assigns to enter into occupy possess and Enjoy the aforesaid Tract of land without let trouble molestation or Interruption from the said Reuben Stringer or any other person or persons claiming the same and finally that the said Reuben Stringer his heirs Executors Administrators shall and will warrant and forever defend the Right and property of the said tract or parcel of land to the said John Moore his heirs and assigns, In Witness whereof the said Reuben Stringer hath hereunto set his hand and seal the day and year first above written

This Indenture made the Eighteenth day of January One Thousand Seven hundred and Eighty Eight, in the twelfth year of American Independence Between John Penny and Ellenor his wife of the State of South Carolina and Spartanburgh County of the one part, and Jonathan Stone farmer of the said State and County of the other part, Witnesseth that the said John Penny and Ellenor his wife for and in consideration of the sum of Twenty Shillings Sterling to them in hand well and truly paid by the said Jonathan Stone at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the Receipt whereof is hereby Acknowledged they the said John Penny and Ellenor his wife hath bargained and sold and by these presents both bargain and sell unto the said Jonathan Stone all that plantation or Tract of one hundred and thirty two acres of land lying and being in Greenville County on the North side of Saluda on the Small Branches of Saluda River having such Shape form and marks as are Represented by the plat unto the grant annexed Reference thereunto had may more fully appear, which said Tract of one hundred and thirty two acres Together with all and singular the Houses outhouses edifices, buildings barns Stables yards gardens, Orchards, woods, underwood Timber and Timber trees, meadows pastures ponds lakes fishings ways waters, water courses paths passages Liberties, privileges profits hereditaments Rights members and appurtenances whatsoever thereunto belonging or in anywise appertaining and the Reversion or Reversions Remainder and Remainders Rents Issues and profits thereof and of every part and parcel thereof To have and to hold the said plantation or Tract of land Containing One hundred and thirty two acres with every the premises and appurtenances thereunto belonging unto the said Jonathan Stone his heirs Executors Administrators and assigns from the day next before the day of the date of these presents on and during and unto the full end and term of one whole year from thence next ensuing and fully to be
