

This Indenture Made the twenth day of January one thousand seven hundred and eighty six and in the tenth year of American Independence, Between Jenny Campbell and John Buchanan both of Fairfield County in Camden district South Carolina Witnesseth that the said Jenny Campbell for and in consideration of the sum of five Shilling Current money to her in hand by the said John Buchanan the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged she the said Jenny Campbell hath bargained and sold, and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell, unto the said John Buchanan a plantation or tract of land containing three hundred and fifty acres of land, Situate and being on the branches of Reedy River, bounding to the Northward on lands laid out for General Richard Munn, with the reversion and reversions, remainder and remainders, rents and services of the said premises above mentioned and of every part and parcel of the same; unto the said John Buchanan his heirs and assigns, from and after the day of the date hereof, for
