

This Indenture made this fourteenth day

of February in the year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and Eighty Nine Between William Austin of the said State and County of Greenville of the one part, and William Richardson of the said State and County of the other part Witnesseth that the said William Austin for and in consideration of the sum of Seventy pounds good and lawfull money to him in hand well and truly paid by the said William Richardson at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby fully acknowledged by the said William Austin and thereof and of and from every part and parcel thereof do acquit and discharge the said William Richardson his heirs & assigns and for divers ^{other} good causes and considerations hereunto moving have granted bargain, sell, Alien, enfeoff and confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain, sell, Alien, enfeoff and confirm unto the said William Richardson his heirs and assigns forever all that part of a certain tract of land of one hundred and fifty acres originally granted to James Saxon and Surveyed for William Austin and signed by his Excellency William Moultrie on the the 28 day of December 1786 beginning at a flat rock near the dwelling house of the said Richardsons and running thence 32 to a Spanish oak marked 3X thence S W 1/4 to a black oak and from thence to a beech near gilders creek thence to the creek to a white oak thence N 70 E to a red oak sapling
