This Indenture made this twenty Eighth day of March in the year of our Lord One thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty Nine Between John Mollin and Elizabeth ^{Mollin} his wife of the one part, and John Williams of the other part both of the State of South Carolina and ninety Six district Wit. Nesseth that the said John Mollin and Elizabeth Mollin for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred pounds Sterling to them in hand paid by the said John Williams at or before the Sealing or ~~delivered~~ delivering of these presents the receipt and payment whereof we do hereby fully acknowledge the said John Mollin and Elizabeth Mollin hath given granted bargained, sold and by these presents Doth give grant bargain and sell alien and release convey and confirm unto the said John Williams and his heirs and assigns forever a certain tract or parcel of land Situate lying and being in the State and and distict aforesaid and on the North fork of Saluda One hundred acres being the same more or less and is part of a greater tract of Two hundred and fifteen acres of land Joining Gabriel Maffitt and Benja^a Merritts Mill Creek crosses the River at the Mouth of the said Creek to the first Station Together with all and singular the woods ways waters water-courses buildings improvements and appurtenances whatsoever unto the said land belonging or in anywise appertaining and the reversion and reversions remain: der and remainders with Issues and profits unto the said John Williams and his heirs and assigns for ever free and from all incumbrances, right Sales, Mortgages, Judgments Executions Dowry's rights of Dowry's and all other incum: brances whatsoever Peaceably and quietly to enjoy the aforesaid tract of land in possession of the said John Williams subject never the less to such rents and dues as shall hereafter be due and payable unto the chief Lord or Lords of the fee, To have and to hold the said bargained premises above described unto the proper use and behoof of him the said John Williams and his heirs and assigns forever and that said John Mollin and Elizabeth Mollin, his heirs Executors, administrators shall and will warrant and by these presents forever defend the above described tract or parcel of land to the said John Williams his heirs Executors administrators and assigns from all and every other person or persons laying any lawful
