101 South Carolina Greenville County August the sixteenth One thousand Seven hundred and eighty nine, A Deed of conveyance for One hundred and fourteen acres of land from Henry Prince to John Stanford, Acknowledged by the said Henry Prince in open court and ordered to be recorded.

This Indenture made this Seventh day of August in the year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and eighty nine, and in the fourth year of the Independence of the united States of America, Between Henry Prince of the State of South Carolina and district of ninety six and Greenville County of the one part, and John Stanford of the same place of the other part, Whereas in and by a certain grant bearing date the fourth day of June Anno Domini One thousand Seven hundred eighty seven from under the hand of his Excellency Thomas Pinckney Esquire Governor and commander in chief in and over the State Charles town for the time being and the great seal of this State for that purpose appointed did give and grant unto Henry Prince a certain tract of one hundred and fourteen acres of land Situate lying on the waters of South Tygar River bounding on lines running S. E. on Henry Prince and Peetleats land N on Davis land all other sides or vacant land and hath shapes form and marks as appears by a plat to the said grant annexed the said plat and grant being
