



4 Executions Dowers and all other incumbrances whatsoever and the said

104 South Carolina Greenville County November the Sixteenth One Thousand  
Seven hundred and Eighty nine, A Deed of conveyance for Six hundred and forty  
acres of land from William Brandon to Jeremiah Stokes, proved by the oath of  
Elisha Green in open court and ordered to be recorded.

This Indenture made the twenty third day of December in the year of our Lord  
one thousand seven hundred and eighty eight, and in the thirteenth year of the  
Independence of the united States of America, between William Brandon of the  
State of South Carolina and Union County of the one part, and Jeremiah Stokes  
of the State aforesaid and Greenville County of the other part: Whereas in and  
by a certain grant bearing date October the fifteenth Anno Domini One thou-  
sand seven hundred and eighty four, under the hand of his Excellency Benja-  
min Guerard Esquire Governor and commander in chief in and over said State,  
unto William Brandon a plantation or tract of six hundred and forty acres of land  
situate in ninety six district, West of the old Indian boundary line, on both sides  
of Reedy River, bounding on all sides by vacant land, having such shape form  
and marks buttings and boundings as are represented by a plat unto the said  
grant annexed, which plat and grant being duly recorded in the Secretarys  
office book 222 page 150 reference thereunto being had may more fully  
appear. Now this Indenture Witnesseth, that the said William Bran-  
don for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred pounds lawful  
money of the State aforesaid to him in hand well and truly paid by the  
said Jeremiah Stokes, at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents,  
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, and that he is well satisfied and  
paid, and have granted, bargained, sold, aliened, released, conveyed and con-  
firmed, unto the said Jeremiah Stokes his heirs and assigns, and by these  
presents doth grant, bargain, sell, alien, release, convey and confirm unto  
the said Jeremiah Stokes his heirs and assigns a plantation or tract of six  
hundred and forty acres of land aforesaid, lying and being as aforesaid. Toge-  
ther with all and singular the Houses, gardens, orchards, timbers, waters,  
and water courses, benefits, profits, privileges, advantages, hereditaments  
and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in anywise appertaining and  
the reversion and reversions, remainder and remainders, rents, issues and  
profits, and every part and parcel thereof, and all the estate, right, title, or  
interest, use, trust, possession, <sup>profit</sup> property, benefit claim and demand whatso-  
ever of him the said William Brandon of, into or out of the same premises  
and every part and parcel thereof, and all deeds, evidences, receipts and  
writings whatsoever touching or concerning the same premises, and  
every part and parcel thereof. To have and to hold the said six hundred and  
forty acres of land with every the premises and appurtenances thereunto
