Each granted, bargained and sold and by these presents Both grant bargain and Sell unto the said Gershom Kelly his Executors Administrators and assigns All that plantation or tract of land on Reedy River near the Indian old boundary line commonly called the Poplar Bottom containing six hundred and forty acres more or less bounded on all sides by vacant land and hath such shape and marks as appears by a plat annex: ed to the original grant thereof made to the said John Winn dated the six: teenth day of July in the year of our Lord 1784 reference being thereunto had may more fully and at large appear Together with all and singular the Houses out houses ways wells waters water courses woods underwoods
