


The following deed of conveyance from Robert Prince to Marson Cox Smithson was proven before Obadiah Hooper Esquire by the Oaths of John Hooper and John Goodlett & recorded this 19<sup>th</sup> March 1790

This Indenture made this \_\_\_\_\_ day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand Seven hundred and Eighty Nine, between Robert Prince of the County of Greenville of the one part, and Marson Cox Smithson of the County aforesaid of the Other part Witnesseth that the said Robert Prince for and in consideration of the Sum of Twenty Pounds to him in hand paid by the said Marson Cox Smithson, the Receipt hereof is hereby Acknowledged granted bargained and sold, and by these present doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Marson Cox Smithson in his Actual Seison possession now being by Virtue of a bargain and Sale to him thereof made by the said Robert Prince and by force of the Statute for Transferring uses into possession and to his heirs and assigns for ever
