Situated on Onoree River above the Indian Boundary
 Beginning at the Beginning corner of v.^d Tract on a Hycory
 thence running with said line to a Black oak the said
 being a corner of Henry & Mitchen's land then with the
 said Mitchen's line a Cross Onoree to Hycory corner on
 south side of said River then up the River to a Red oak
 corner of Stephen Cantrel's land thence a Cross the River
 at a little shoal with a Strait line with Cantrel's
 line to a stake at the head of a small Branch on v.^d
 Ballinger's line and Morgans line then to the Beginning
 and the Grant bearing date the seventeenth day Novem-
 ber seventeen hundred Eighty & five and in the Tenth
 year of the Independance of America Recorded in
 Secretary's Office in Grant Book D. C. C. Page 534
 Reference being thereunto had may more fully appear
 at large by a plat of v.^d Grant &c. Together with all
 Trees woods underwoods Tithes commons & Common
 of pasture way and waters and water Courses whats-
 soever belonging to the v.^d Tract or in any wise appur-
 taining and also the Reversion and Reversions
 Remainder and Remainders Rents and services of the
 said premises above mentioned and of every part
 thereof and also all the Rights Tithes Interest claims &
 demands of him the J.^r Edward Ballinger or his heirs
 the said Tract of Land containing one hundred &
 ninety five acres and every part and parcel
 thereof To have & to hold the v.^d Messuage and
 Tenement and all and singular the premises above
 mentioned unto the said Isaac Gray his heirs
 and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of
 the J.^r Isaac Gray his heirs and assigns for ever
