

386 The following Deed of Conveyance from Hardin Camp &
Robert Duncan, being proven before John Thomas Esq. by the
oath of David Brock was recorded this 16th Day of Dec. 1779
This Indenture made this - in the year of our Lord one thou-
sand seven hundred & ninety three and in the eighteenth year
of the Independance of the united States of America between
Hardin Camp & Robert Duncan of Ninety Six District and
South Carolina of the one part & David Brock of the State
and District aforesaid of the other part, whereas in & by a
Certain Grant bearing date the first day of August one
thousand seven hundred & eighty five from under the hand
of his Excellency William Moultrie Esq. Governor for the
time being did give & Grant unto the said Robert Duncan &
Mechanic Langston patent bearing date the third day of
April one thousand seven hundred & eighty six having such
shapes and forms & marks as the plats thereof to the Original
Grants it being above the Antient boundary line on
the Branches of Needy River - the said plats & Grants
being duly Recorded in the Secretaries Office & they
in that the said Hardin Camp & Robert Duncan for & in
consideration of the sum of five Shillings to them ^{they} the
said Hardin Camp & Robert Duncan in hand paid ~~by~~
said Hardin Camp & Robert Duncan hath Granted
bargained sold & by these presents doth bargain & sell unto
the said David Brock his heirs & assigns two hundred &
seventy acres of Land in Ninety six District on Duncans
Branch of Needy River butting & bounding on said Robt.
Duncan and James McElroy & James Neely which
plantation or tract of Land was Granted to said Rob-
ert Duncan & Mechanic Langston, with all houses
out houses buildings trees woods under woods & the
commons common of pasture ways water courses
profits commodities advantages hereditaments and
appurtenances whatsoever to the said tract of two
