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The following Deed of Conveyance from William Stinson to Josiah
La^o Foster being proven before Mr. B. Grigsby Esq^r was Recorded
this 10th June 1794 proven by the oath of Mr. Crow Foster.

This Indenture made the twenty sixth day of October and in
the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety three
and in the eighteenth year of the Independence of the United
States, Between William Stinson and Mary Stenson his wife of
the County of Greenville and State of Carolina of the one part
and Josiah Foster and James Hoggatt Foster of the County & State
aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said William Stin-
son & Mary Stenson his wife for and in consideration of the
sum of two hundred pounds Sterling to them in hand paid the
receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge, hath granted bar-
gained and sold, and by these presents doth grant bargain and
sell unto the Josiah Foster and James Hoggatt Foster their heirs
and assigns all their plantations or tracts of land containing two
hundred and fifty acres be the same more or less lying being
on the Middle fork and main River of Saluda and bounded as
follows, beginning on a Buck eye Tree standing on the bank of the
said Middle River adjoining Samuel Earle's land and running
from thence S^o 49 chains to a Hickory tree, thence running S^o 20th
12 chains to a red oak on the bank of the River, thence up the vari-
ous meanders of the River to the beginning, and also fifty acres
adjoining the above mentioned land as appears in deed conveyance
from Daniel Kelly to William Hleppe from him to S^o Stinson
