

1196 The following Bill of Sale from John Hunt to Merry Hall
being proven before Parkin Tarant Esquire by the
Oath of John Mabeath was Recorded this 25th day of June 1794
It now all men by these presents that I John Hunt of the
State of South Carolina and Greenville County have bargained
sold and delivered unto Merry Hall a Negro Girl named
Dider for the consideration of fifty pounds to me in hand
paid by the said Hall and the said Hunt will warrant
and for ever defend the said Negro Dider to him the
said Hall his heirs &c free and clear from me my heirs
&c and from all and every person or persons whatsover
saying any claim title or demand to his the said Negro
Dider or her Increase In Witness of the same I have here-
unto set my hand and seal this fiftenth day of February
Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and
ninety four

1196 The following deed of Conveyance from David Black to
Abner Bishop being proven before Parkin Tarant Esq^r by
the oath of Sarene Brasher was Recorded this 25th June 1794
