

539 The following Deed of Conveyance from Joseph Maxwell & Thomas Maxwell to James Fowler being proven before Reuben Barrett Esq^r by the oath of James Maxwell was presented & recorded this 3rd Day of Feb^r 1724
This Indenture made this first day of September Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and ninety three by & Between Joseph Maxwell & Thomas Maxwell both of the State of South Carolina Ninety six District and Greenville County of the one part, & James Fowler of the same place of the other part, whereas in and by a certain Grant bearing date the fifth day of June Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred & Eighty six from under the hand of his Excellency William Moultrie Esq^r Governor and commander in chief at Charleston & the great seal of this State for that purpose appointed did give & Grant unto Duncan Campbell a certain plantation or tract of land containing one hundred and Eighty two acres which tract of one hundred and eighty two acres of land the said Duncan Campbell did bargain sell and convey to the above named Joseph Maxwell, again in & by a certain Grant bearing date the seventh day of April Anno D. one thousand seven hundred and eighty eight from under the hand of his Excellency Thomas Pinckney Esq^r Governor at Charleston for the time being and the great seal of the said State, did give and Grant unto Thomas Maxwell a certain tract of two hundred & four acres of land lying on both sides of Gowens Creek and hath such shape form & marks as appears by a plat to the said Grant annexed, and further in & by a certain Grant bearing date the fifth day of December Anno D. one thousand seven hundred and ninety one from under the hand of his Excellency Charles Pinckney Esq^r Governor & commander at Charleston for the time being the great seal of the S^t. State did give and grant unto Joseph Maxwell certain tract of land containing
