This Indenture made this twenty ninth day of March Anno Domini  
 one thousand seven hundred Ninety four by & Between Joseph Maxwell  
 of Buncom County State of North Carolina of the one part & John  
 Headleton of the State of South Carolina ninety six District &  
 Greenville County of the other part whereas in & by a certain Grant  
 bearing date the fifth day of December Anno Domini one thousand  
 seven hundred Ninety one from under the hand of his Excellency  
 Charles Pinckney Esq<sup>r</sup>. Governor & Commander in chief in & over the S<sup>r</sup>.  
 State at Columbia for the time being & the great Seal of this State for that  
 purpose appointed did give & Grant unto Joseph Maxwell a certain  
 tract three hundred & twenty six acres of land situate lying on Green  
 & Gowens Creek of the South fork of Daroale River bounded by lines  
 running South West & South East by Samuel Eastlys land North East by
