79 The following Deed of Conveyance from John Wilson to Richard Jones being proven before W^m. Mitcherson Esq^r. by the oath of W^m. Jones was presented and recorded this 30th Apr. 1795

This Indenture made this twenty eighth day of June one thousand seven hundred and ninety four and in the nineteenth year of American Independance between John Wilson of Greenville County & State So. Carolina of one part and Richard Jones of the State and County aforesaid of the other part and whereas in & by two certain Grants one granted by George the third King of great Brittain to Richard Fowler two hundred acres of land on Durbens Creek in Berklely County bearing date 28 of November 1771 then from Richard Fowler to his son Joshua Fowler his heir of Dowry then from Joshua Fowler to John Wilson by lawful title the other granted to Joseph Burchfield two hundred and four acres of land on Durbens Creek in Greenville County signed by Benjamin Guerrard Governor in and over said State dated 1785 then by the said Joseph Burchfield by lease and release to Joshua Fowler then from Joshua Fowler to John Wilson by lawful title Now this Indenture witnesseth that he the said John Wilson hath for and in consideration of thirty pounds Sterling to him in hand the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged bargained sold remised released conveyed and confirmed and by these presents doth bargain sell alien convey & confirm unto Richard Jones a plantation or tract of land in Greenville
