

The following deed of Conveyance from Thomas Revil to Thomas Fargison being proven before Robt. M. J. Esq. by the oath of James Fargison was presented and recorded this 9<sup>th</sup> day of June A.D. 1790

This Indenture made the fourteenth day of October for the year one thousand seven hundred and ninety four and in the eighteenth year of American Independance between Thomas Revil of the state of South Carolina, Laurens County planter of the one part & Thomas Fargison of the said state & County of Greenville of the other part, whereas in & by a certain grant bearing date the third day of March in the year one thousand seven hundred and eighty eight from under the hand of Thomas Pinckney Esq. then Governor and commandee in chief of the said state of South Carolina and the great seal of the state for that purpose appointed did give and grant unto Thomas Revil a plantation or tract of seven hundred and fifty acres of land on a creek called Brushey Creek the waters of Enoree River having such shape form and marks as a plat to the said grant annexed represents the said grant being duly recorded in the Secretaries Office for the time being in grant Book W.W.W.W. page 311 reference to said Record fully appears Now this Indenture witnesseth that the said Thomas Revil for & in consideration of fifteen pounds to him in hand paid by the said Thomas Fargison the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged he the said Thomas Revil hath bargained & sold remised released and conveyed and confirmed & by these presents doth bargain & sell remise release convey and confirm unto the said Thomas Fargison one hundred acres be it more or less being part of the said tract of seven hundred and fifty acres beginning on a spanish oak running N 50 E 50 to a red oak from thence running North 40 W 20 to Alstons line continuing on Alstons Line till it comes to the back line from thence running S 50 W 50 to a post oak from thence running S 10 E 10 including all the land within these bounds together & singular with all the Houses buildings barns, Stables gardens orchards, trees woods waters water courses or whatsoever may be thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining without the least reserve whatsoever and the said Thomas Fargison his heirs Executors Administrators or assigns or any from under the Authority of the said Thomas Fargison shall & may from time to time and at all times whatsoever agreeable to his or their own will & pleasure have hold use occupy & enjoy the said Tract or part of the said Tract of seven hundred and fifty acres supposed to be one hundred acres be the same more or less without any manner of Hindrance trouble Molestation or Interruption or denial of him the said Thomas Revil his heirs Executors Administrators assigns or any other person or persons whatsoever the said Tract of one hundred acres be it more or less as aforesaid unto the said Thomas Fargison his heirs Executors Administrators or assigns shall and will warrant & defend
