The following Deed of Conveyance from John Layman to George French being proven before A. Cobb Esquire by the oath of John Nelson was presented and recorded this 9th day of August 1776 South Carolina This Indenture made the fifth day of September one thousand seven hundred and ninety four between John Layman Sen^r of Greenville County State aforesaid of the one part George French of the same place of the other part witnesseth that the said John Layman for & in consideration of the sum of thirty pounds Sterling to him in hand paid
