The following Deed of Conveyance from John Moody to William Cox Senr.  
 being proven before Thomas Edwards Esq. by the oath of Benjamin Pollard  
 was presented and recorded this 20<sup>th</sup> day of April 1797  
 This Indenture made this twenty eighth day of October in the year of our  
 Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety six and in the twentieth year  
 of American Independance between John Moody of the State of South Carolina  
 and Greenville County of the one part, and William Cox Senr. of the said State  
 and County of the other part witnesseth that the said John Moody for & in  
 consideration of the sum of fifty pounds sterling money paid by the said  
 William Cox Senr. at and before the sealing & delivery of these presents the  
 receipt whereof the said John Moody doth hereby acknowledge and of &  
 from every part and parcel thereof do acquit & discharge the S. William Cox  
 Senr. his heirs and assigns do grant bargain sell alien and confirm unto the  
 said William Cox his heirs and assigns for ever eighty acres of land more or  
 less situate in Greenville County on a branch of the golden grove being  
 part of a tract of land Originally granted to Jesse Moody & signed by his Ex-  
 cellency Thomas Pinckney on the fourth day of June one thousand seven  
 hundred and eighty seven, and in the eleventh year of the Independance of  
 the united States of America as by a plat annexed to the said grant will more  
 fully appear laid out to the said William Cox Senr. as follows begining on  
 Moody line on a post oak corner thence running Eastward along a Condition  
 line 30 chanes to a red oak corner thence running northward to a corner on Petty  
 Princes line, thence running the S. Princes line to a condition line between  
 Henry Mack and the S. Land opposite Smith Corner, thence to Smith  
 Corner thence running Southwardly along the said Williams Cox Senr line to  
 Moody's line & to the begining corner Including eighty acres more or  
 less Together with all and singular the houses out houses ways waters paths  
 passages easements hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to  
 the said land so described as above belonging or in any wise appar-  
 taining to the reversion and reversions, remainder and remainders  
 rents profits thereof and every part & parcel thereof & all the es-  
 tate, right, interest claim and demand whatsoever both in law & equity  
 of the said John Moody of in & to the same premises & of in & to every part
