The following deed of conveyance from Elizabeth Rogers  
 to Miriam Byrn being proven before Willy A. Brown  
 Esquire by the oath of Sterling Ingram was presented  
 and recorded this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of April 1801.

To all people to whom these presents shall come  
 I Elizabeth Rogers of Greenville District in the  
 State of Carolina do send greeting knowing that  
 the said Elizabeth Rogers for and in consideration  
 of the love good will & affection to, as also in con-  
 sideration of the sum of three dollars well & truly  
 paid by my daughter Miriam Byrn of the  
 District aforesaid have given and granted and by  
 these presents do freely give and grant unto the said  
 Miriam Byrn her heirs Executors & Administra-  
 tors all and singular the goods & chattels here after  
 mentioned to wit one negro man named Peter  
 all the lands falling to me by the death of my son  
 Ezias Earle deceased, twenty two head of cattle two  
 Black mares all my house hold and kitchen Furna-  
 ture except one negro girl named <sup>one</sup> ~~one~~ & one bed
