

This Indenture made the twenty eighth of October  
One thousand seven hundred and ninety & in the  
fourteenth year of American independence between  
James Barton of the state of Carolina Greenville  
County of the one part & David McDavid of the  
state & county aforesaid of the other part Whereas  
in and by a certain grant bearing date the twentyfirst  
day of January 1775 and in the great seal of the  
said state for that purpose appointed do give &  
grant unto John Bedman a plantation or  
tract of land of six hundred and forty acres  
on the waters of a creek called Durbens Creek  
in the state aforesaid & District of ninety six now  
called Greenville County recorded in the secretaries  
Office for the said state in Book CCCC page 49.  
Reference there unto had more fully appears this  
Indenture witnesseth that said James Barton  
for and in consideration of One hundred pounds  
sterling to him in hand paid by said David McDavid  
the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged he the said  
James Barton hath Granted bargained sold Remised  
released conveyed and confirmed & by these presents doth  
grant bargain sell remise release convey & confirm  
unto the said David McDavid his heirs and assigns one  
hundred acres acres of land being part of the said tract  
of six hundred and forty acres beginning on a maple  
on the said creek and runs thence North 15<sup>o</sup> Degrees east  
with the said line of six hundred and forty acres to a post  
 oak thence South seventy five degrees east 5<sup>1/4</sup> chain  
to a stake on the said line of the said tract six hun-  
dred and forty acres thence South 15<sup>o</sup> Degrees West
