

225 The following deed of conveyance from Thomas Nations to <sup>Wm</sup> Goldsmith  
being proven before <sup>John</sup> Kellogg Esq<sup>r</sup> by the oath of James  
Halks was presented and recorded this 30<sup>th</sup> day of June 1817  
These Indentures made this 14<sup>th</sup> day of Feb<sup>r</sup> 1817 One thou-  
sand seven hundred and ninety nine and in the twenty  
third year of the Independence of the united states of  
america between Thomas Nations of Crunville  
County and state of south Carolina, of the one part &  
and <sup>Wm</sup> Goldsmith of the state and County aforesaid  
of the other part whereas by a certain grant bearing  
date the fifth day of June 1786 recorded in grant  
book M M N page 93 sign'd by his Excellency Wm  
Moultrie Esq<sup>r</sup> then Governor and commander in chief  
in and over said state did give and grant unto Robert  
Goodwin a plantation or tract of some hundred and  
fifty two acres of land it being then ninety six  
Distribut then by lawful letters conveyed to <sup>Sam</sup> Wright  
then from said Wright to John Wilson, and from  
said Wilson, to said Nations now these indenture witness  
eth that he the said Thomas Nations hath for  
an inconsideration of the sum of fifty pounds sterling  
to him in hand paid by the said William Goldsmith the  
receipt of which is here by acknowledged hath bargained  
& sold and by these presents doth bargain sell convey  
and confirm unto the said William Goldsmith a planta-  
tion with all that part of the above mentioned tract  
of land that lyeth on the north side of the main fork  
of Durbin creek in state and county aforesaid beginning  
at a post oak running thence N 65° W 31 ch<sup>s</sup> to a black  
oak thence S 55° W 17 ch<sup>s</sup> to a post oak thence
