 granted bargained and sold & Released unto the s<sup>d</sup> John  
 Wigganton, & by these Presents doth grant bargain sell and  
 Release, unto him the s<sup>d</sup> John Wigganton a certain Tract  
 of Land lying on the North side of Oil Camp Creek, beginning  
 at a Dogwood upon Mannins old line from thence to a Spanish  
 Oak, & a Conditioal line from thence to the back line to a Stake  
 Corner from thence on the said line to a Stake Corner from  
 thence to Mannins <sup>old</sup> line a Stake Corner, from thence on the said  
 line
