 1786. Reference being thereunto had will more fully ap-
 -pear, all that part of said? tract beginning on a Red Oak on the
 Ridge Road, thence N. E. 65^o twenty three chains to a Red Oak
 old Corner, thence N. W. 10^o forty two & fifty links to a large
 Red Oak on the original line, and Martins line, thence
 S. E. 50^o to a Red Oak Corner on S. Martins line North
 East side of Mountain Creek, thence to a Stake on S.
 Creek at Mouth of William Davis Spring branch, thence
 meandering with said? Creek to White Oak Corner thence
 along an agreement line made by said? Cobb & Nathan
 Reed to a Stake at the Corner of W. Davis fence thence
 a short course with said fence along a line of Glas-
 -trees to a Red Oak on the said? Ridge Road, thence Meandering
