Together with all Singular the rights members here contained and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise appertaining To have and to hold all and singular the premises unto the S^d Larkin Tarrant his heirs and assigns for ever. and we do hereby bind ourselves our heirs ~~executors~~ & representatives to warrant and for ever defend all and singular the above bargained premises unto the said Larkin Tarrant his heirs & assigns against ours does our heirs ~~assigns~~ & against all and every person lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
